If both an argument in favor of and against a measure have been selected for publication in the voter information pamphlet, a rebuttal to the argument in favor of or the argument against the measure may be submitted as outlined in this form.

The author of the argument in favor of the measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument to the argument against the measure or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument. Likewise, the author of the argument against the measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument to the argument in favor of the measure or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument.

A rebuttal argument shall not be accepted unless accompanied by this completed form, which shall contain the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it or, if submitted on behalf of a bona fide association of citizens/organization, the name of the association/organization and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers.

Word count limit for Rebuttal Arguments = 250

The rebuttal arguments shall be submitted to the elections official conducting the election no later than March 26, 2018.

These rules apply to all rebuttal arguments unless a rebuttal argument is otherwise provided by law.

Las Lomas Elementary School \$70M Bond: Rebuttal to the Argument in Favor Measure R

Las Lomas Elementary School District claims they need \$70M (plus 32 years of interest) to "repair/improve aging schools", virtually identical to the "repair and improve aging schools" statement made for the \$60M bond in 2013.

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This begs the question, why are repairs not part of the normal yearly budget?

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Just five years ago they wanted \$60M to "build classrooms for increased student enrollment". But, student **enrollment has declined**, not increased.

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Just five years ago they wanted \$60M to "to meet current **health/safety** codes" and now 5-years later they want \$70M to "meet health, **safety/seismic** codes".

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Déjà vu all over again?

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Just 5-years ago they wanted to "renovate **heating/electrical** systems" and now they want another \$70M to "upgrade...**electrical/heating**...". It's amazing how fast electrical and heating systems become obsolete.

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If you thinks that's nuts, we encourage you to vote **NO on Measure R**.

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Las Lomas Elementary School District is already spending \$432,377 per class per year (23 students x \$18,799 per student. Source: California Educational Data Partnership

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The average salary and benefits for teachers is \$109,585.

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Subtract \$109,585 and that's still over \$320K per classroom per year. More than enough to buy every student the best laptop on the market.

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The administration just wants more of your hard earned money to pad their salaries and fat pension plans.

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Tell the Las Lomas Elementary School District Board to be fiscally responsible.

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Vote NO on Measure R.
