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ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE

RECEIVED

17 Measure __ is NOT a new tax and will NOT raise taxes for homeowners or renters in Foster 14 City. Transient occupancy (or "hotel") taxes are paid by travelers staying at our three local 13 hotels. Services like police, fire, street and streetlight maintenance, and parks and recreation 18 serve not only our residents and local businesses, but also those that stay in our hotels. While the 19 costs of providing those services have risen, the hotel tax was at 8% since it was first adopted in 17 1981 and has been at 9.5% since 2012. Both the lowest in the County. With this proposed 15 increase, Foster City will still have one of the lowest TOT rates in San Mateo County.

lo The proposed increase will be phased in over time and will initially raise an estimated \$271,800 ls in the first year, rising to \$981,000 by fiscal year 2022-2023. Starting back in 2010, the City 14 eliminated about 10% of its workforce, trimmed \$2 million in spending, and negotiated reduced 14 pension benefits with its police officers and firefighters. Despite that, our projections show a structural deficit with expenses exceeding revenues. Going forward, our choices are clear - find q additional revenue or face deep cuts in essential services.

18 Measure __ applies only to travelers staying at hotels or motels in our city - the hotel tax has no 12 impact on Foster City homeowners or renters. Voting YES ON MEASURE __ means these 19 visitors will pay their fair share of the costs for the police, fire, and other essential services they 2-rely upon.
