### Argument Against Daly City Sales Tax Increase: Measure

The Daly City Council in their resolution authorizing this proposed sales tax increase (to 19,75%) says it is to "provide emergency funding", but it is a permanent tax increase.

They also project that this sales tax increase is going to bring in "\$6,000,000 annually".

In other words, this sales tax increase is NOT an emergency, but just an ordinary bait and switch tax measure. Emergencies do not last forever, but this tax will if passed.

But, if all of these projects listed in the ballot statement are truly a Daly City Council priority, why are they **NOT** in the current budget?

Budgets are how governments sets spending priorities.

Clearly "fire and 911 emergency" and "addressing homelessness" are not priorities according to their current budget. Nor is "preparing for natural disaster and public health emergencies".

When governments put tax increases on the ballot, they are indirectly saying everything in our current budget is MORE important than the projects supposedly to be funded by this sales tax increase.

Furthermore, another sales tax increase will not only drive more purchases to Internet businesses, where sales taxes are not collected at all and sales will be taken away from local businesses, further hurting the local economy. It will also hurt those on fixed incomes the hardest, i.e. the poor, the retired elderly, the disabled, and those on fixed incomes.
