So, how well does Portola Valley School District compete with other top school districts in San Mateo County?

Education Data Partnership (www.Ed-Data.k12.ca.us) can provide some illuminating answers.

The district students for the 2011-12 school year (latest available) scored at "Proficient" or "Advanced" 15 in the following STAR categories: S

Category	Portola Valley	Las Lomitas
English	90%	92%
Mathematics	88%	90%
Science	93%	95%
History	81%	96%

The Las Lomitas Elementary School District scored higher in every category. (C

Let's compare expenditures for each of these districts for 2010-11.

Average Daily Attendance expenditures (all activities): 🕼

- Las Lomitas Elementary: \$12,515 - Portola Valley School District: \$17,613

Las Lomitas Elementary School District spent \$5,098 LESS than Portola Valley School District, and yet earned better results in every category. 6
