Millbrae Elementary School District \$125 Parcel Tax: Argument Against - Measure A

In 2018, voters passed Measure N to:

“...maintain 21st century, hands-on science labs, technology, engineering/math instruction; strengthen reading/writing programs; attract/retain qualified teachers; and restore art/music programs.”

With this latest “temporary” parcel tax, Millbrae Elementary School District claims they need more money to continue providing quality education.

Have they earned the privilege of taxing us and our neighbors another \$1,125 over the next 9 years (on top of the taxes we already pay)?

Let's compare students' test scores for English language/literacy, then and now:

- 2017-18 school year:
67.03% of students met standards.
Which means: **32.98% did NOT.**
- 2021-22:
65.09% met standards.
So 34.90% did NOT!

Which means: **Scores worsened, since we granted them Measure N funding!**

Should every homeowner have to award this C- district a prize of \$1,125?

If you answered NO, we encourage you to vote **NO on Measure A.**

For mathematics?

- 2021-22:
Only 60.05% of students met standards!

No wonder enrollment declined by 310 students since 2018.

Millbrae Elementary School District already **spends \$12,419/student per year.**

For the average class of 23.5 students, **that's \$291,846/class.**

Teachers' average salary is \$85,508 + \$9,600 in benefits, per shortened work year...

...leaving **\$196,739/class for administration!**

Yet they want MORE of our hard-earned money to pad their salaries and fat pension plans.

They say no funds will go for administration. But, funds generated separately from this tax can be used for administration expenses—without limit. So, that is an empty promise. Do not be fooled.

Vote NO on Measure A.

Rewarding failure just gets us more failure!

You can be FOR children, FOR education, and FOR teachers, but AGAINST incessant, ineffective tax-and-spend schemes.
