## ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE

The position of San Carlos City Treasurer should remain an elected position. Making it appointed by the City Council removes direct authority from the citizens and concentrates it in the City Council. Direct citizen oversight enhances liberty.

While it's tempting to argue certain financial qualifications should be required, those benefits are outweighed by maintaining direct citizen oversight. The State of California Treasurer likewise requires no such qualifications and is elected directly by the citizens. The fact that other peninsula cities have already converted to an appointed treasurer is not a reason for us to follow suit.

This is consistent with the Tenth Amendment to The Constitution stating that power not delegated to The Federal Government resides in the states or The People.

My opinion is based on my education (MBA, UC Berkeley) and experience in the general field of finance. I am a Certified Financial Planner® and retired corporate banker plus 25 years' experience as a consulting partner in an accounting firm.
